Netball Young Organisers Award

The aim of this 6 hour course is to offer young people aged 14 - 18 years the opportunity to take the first step on the coaching, officiating or administration Netball ladder. It prepares them to organise safe, enjoyable and purposeful Netball sessions for 7 - 11 year olds, under the supervision of a teacher or coach.

Candidates: Young people aged 14 - 18 years. No Netball knowledge required.

Course Outcomes

By attending the Young Netball Organiser course, young people should be able to:

- Plan and deliver a safe session
- Identify and teach/coach basic skills
- Progress basic skills into a small game situation
- Develop the game of High 5 Netball
- Use resources to support sessions
- Introduce relevant / appropriate rules within a session
- Identify opportunities for children to play Netball at school and in the community
- To organise a Netball fun day or mini tournament

Badminton Junior Helper Award (BJHA)

The Badminton Junior Helper Award (BJHA) is aimed at young people from 13 years upwards. The course is presented as a series of workshops focusing on each aspect and is designed to present the early stages of leadership in a fun yet informative way.

Candidates: Young people from 13 years upwards

Cricket Young Leaders Award

The aim of the Cricket Young Leaders Award is to raise the profile of cricket within a Young Leadership role, inspire Young Leaders to get actively involved with cricket and help provide additional support for Kwik Cricket tournaments.

Aim:

- Raise cricket profile within a Young Leadership role
- Inspire Young Leaders to get actively involved with cricket
- Help provide additional support for KWIK cricket tournaments
- To help develop generic leaderships skills in a cricket context
- Identify potential pathways for Young Leaders in cricket

Candidates: Age 14 – 18 years

Basketball Foundation Course in Coaching

The Foundation Award focuses on introducing the game and its fundamental skills to beginners and young players. During each course the candidates will be continually assessed and given feedback on their knowledge of introducing fundamental skills. Candidates receive an England Basketball Foundation Course in Coaching Manual and following the successful completion of the course, a certificate. Please remember that, even though the course will enhance your basketball skills, the England Basketball Foundation in Coaching Award is for individuals wanting to coach others.

Course Outcomes

- By the end of this course a candidate will be:
- Aware of the requirements of the Foundation in Coaching Basketball Award.
- Aware of the roles of a coach
- Able to demonstrate a basic understanding of coaching and teaching skills.
- Able to conduct a warm-up and cool-down with players.
- Able to introduce the basic fundamentals to beginners.
- Able to provide demonstration of the basic individual skills of basketball.
- Able to give instructions to players when coaching.
- Able to give feedback and encourage progression.
- Able to reflect on their own delivery.
